

## **Game of the Day Glossary for the 2020 Season**

### **General Reminders:**

Exchange scorecards at the first tee for Individual games, for Team games the four-some captain will keep score.

Always keep your own score for posting and check to make sure it matches the official scorecard at the end of the game. You must sign your scorecard to be eligible for prizes. Once you finish the round of golf, please deposit your signed scorecard in the wooden box on the table in the Ladies locker room.

All holes must be puttied out, no conceded putts, unless it's allowable under the rules for the Game of the Day, i.e. 4-Ball Match play or the Eclectic Tournament. If you chose to 'pick up", you will not be eligible for the Game of the Day prizes.

Participation in the Toonie Pot is voluntary. If you choose to participate, please bring your toonie to the Pro Shop when you're checking in on Tuesday morning and sign-up.

### **Preseason: March 31, 2020 and April 7, 2020 – Regular Game of Golf**

For these two preseason games, we welcome returning members, and any prospective members, to come out for a round of golf. These will be regular games of golf, and the 4-somes will be made up randomly. Keep your own score, and if the course is in Active season, please post your scores. There will be one KP on #9 open to all participants.

### **April 14, 2020 – Opening Day Scramble – 8:30 Shotgun and Lunch Meeting**

Please indicate your lunch choice on the sign-up sheet.

8:30 AM – Shotgun start, your starting hole will be indicated on the Draw.

This is a team game: The four-woman scramble features teams of four players competing against one another. In this format, all team members hit from the tee box, the team then chooses the best of the four shots. All players – except the person whose ball is selected, hit the next shot from this mark. Play continues in this manner until at least one ball is on the green. Everyone takes one putt from the chosen location on the green. If the ball is not holed out, pick up the ball, and add one more stroke to the team score. (Count a maximum of 2 putts per hole.) Note: Use a minimum of 2 drives for each team member.

Prizes will be awarded to the team with the lowest gross score.

An additional prize will be awarded for one KP on #9.

### **April 21, 2020 – Putting Around - Fewest Putts**

This is an Individual game. Play a regular game and record the number of putts taken on the scorecard. (A putt is a shot taken once you're ON the green.) Winners will be members with the fewest putts in each flight.

Toonie Pot – KP on # 9 (flighted)

### **April 28, 2020 – Team Match Play**

Players will be divided into two teams, Team St. Charles (Canadian 2010 LPGA event), and Team Summerlea (Canadian 2002 LPGA event).

Each foursome will consist of two teams of two players competing directly against each other (four-ball match play). All four golfers play their own balls throughout the round; each hole is won by the team whose member has the lowest net score. If the hole is tied, each team gets half a point. Each player will play to the lowest handicap in the group, and will get strokes on holes based on this handicap differential. Keep track of how many points are won by each pairing as these scores will be used to determine the overall team score.(Keep your own score for posting purposes.)

Toonie Pot – Closest to the Line (flighted)

### **May 5, 2020 – Low Gross Flighted – Pin/Putts #1**

This is an Individual game. Winners will be determined by the lowest gross scores in 3 flights.

If you are participating in the Ladies Club Putts competition this year, please record your putts on the scorecard in the appropriate place. (A putt is a shot taken once you're ON the green.) If you are participating in the Pin Round competition your net score will be used for the year end results

Toonie Pot – KP #9 (flighted) & KP #17 (flighted)

### **May 12, 2020 – Four Ball, Two Best Net**

This is a team game. Each player plays her own ball. On each hole, the two best net scores will be used for the score for that hole. Winners will be the teams with the lowest net scores. .(Keep your own score for posting purposes.)

Toonie Pot – Longest Drive (flighted), KP #9 (one for all flights)

## **May 19, 2020 – Eclectic Tournament Day 1**

A two-day tournament playing for the Crystal Bowl Trophy. The final score is calculated by using your best gross score for each hole over the two days, minus your handicap. A luncheon and awards will follow the second round of golf.

## **June 2, 2020 - Individual Low Net Flighted – Beat the Champ/Beat the & Pro & Pin/Putts #2**

This is a regular game of golf. Winners in each flight will be determined by their net scores.

Beat the Champ - If you have paid the \$1 to participate in Beat the Champ your net score will be used for the competition. If your net score is better than the 2018 Provincial Amateur Champion's net score, you will have beaten the Champ.

If you are participating in the Ladies Club Putts competition this year, please record your putts on the scorecard in the appropriate place. (A putt is a shot taken once you're ON the green.) If you are participating in the Pin Round competition your net score will be used for the year end results.

Toonie Pot – KP #9 & KP #17 (flighted)

***Beat the Champ description*** - is a round of golf played during the month of June (usually in the first week). Junior Golf Week was originally designed by the BC Ladies' Golf Association and is an important source of funds for junior development. All funds collected go directly to our Zone. The round is played against (in this year's case) the 2019 BC Women's Amateur Champion and decided by the player's net differential in relation to the Champion's lowest gross differential. Complicated? Yes! That is why most of us just consider this to be donation to a worthy cause.

## **June 9, 2020 – Team Stableford**

This is a team game. The team captain will keep the team's scores.  
(Please keep track of your own scores for posting.)

Stableford Scoring:

- 1 point for NET bogey
- 2 points for NET par
- 3 points for NET birdie
- 4 points for NET eagle
- 5 points for NET double eagle

The best 2 Stableford scores will be used on each hole.

### **June 16, 2020 – NO Putts**

This is an Individual game. Please play a regular game to the green. Once on the green, calculate the number of putts to complete the hole in accordance with Golf Canada regulations. You may choose to putt out, but DO NOT remove or touch the flag stick.

### **June 23, 2020 – Eclectic Tournament Day 1**

A two-day tournament playing for the Crystal Bowl Trophy. The final score is calculated by using your best gross score for each hole over the two days, minus your handicap. A luncheon and awards will follow the second round of golf.

### **June 30,2020 – Eclectic Tournament Day 2**

### **July 7, 2020 – Individual Low Net**

This is a regular game of golf. Winners in each flight will be determined by their net scores.

### **July 14, 2020 – Team Match Play**

Players will be divided into two teams, Team Royal Mayfair (Canadian 2013 LPGA event), and Team Hillside (Canadian 2011 LPGA event).

Each foursome will consist of two teams of two players competing directly against each other (four-ball match play). All four golfers play their own balls throughout the round; each hole is won by the team whose member has the lowest net score. If the hole is tied, each team gets half a point. Each player will play to the lowest handicap in the group, and will get strokes on holes based on this handicap differential. Keep track of how many points are won by each pairing as these scores will be used to determine the overall team score. (Keep your own score for posting purposes.)

### **July 21, 2020 – Senior/Super Senior Tournament – Day 1**

A 36-hole Stroke Play Tournament for the Dogwood Cup (Net) & the Whale Trophy (Gross). The Golden Girl Trophy for members 70 yrs.+ is awarded to the low net in this age group.

### **July 28, 2020 – Senior/Super Senior Tournament – Day 2**

### **August 4, 2020 – Bingo, Bango, Bongo**

Points are given for the ball first on the green, closest to the pin and first putted out, so there are potentially three points available per player on each hole. Highest total of points at the game end is the winner.

### **August 11, 2020 – TEE TO GREE (previously called NO Putts)**

This is an Individual game. Please play a regular game from the tee to the green.

Once on the green, calculate the number of putts to complete the hole in accordance with Golf Canada regulations. You may choose to putt out, but DO NOT remove or touch the flag stick.

### **August 18, 2020 – Team Stableford**

This is a team game. The team captain will keep the team's scores. (Keep your own score for posting purposes).

#### **Stableford Scoring:**

- 1 Point for NET bogey
- 2 Points for NET par
- 3 Points for NET birdie
- 4 Points for NET eagle
- 5 Points for NET double eagle

The best 2 Stableford scores will be used on each hole.

### **August 25, 2020– Individual Low Net Flighted**

This is a regular game of golf. Winners in each flight will be determined by their net scores.

### **August 27, 2020 – Intraclub – Men vs Ladies**

8 am Shotgun followed by luncheon.

### **September 1, 2020 – Course closed for Aeration**

### **September 8, 2020 – Low Gross Flighted**

This is an Individual game. Winners will be determined by the lowest gross scores in 3 flights.

If you are participating in the Pin Round competition your net score will be used for the year end results.

### **September 15, 2020 – Team Stableford**

This is a team game. The team captain will keep the team's scores. (Keep your own score for posting purposes).

#### **Stableford Scoring:**

- 1 Point for NET bogey
- 2 Points for NET par
- 3 Points for NET birdie
- 4 Points for NET eagle
- 5 Points for NET double eagle

The best 2 Stableford scores will be used on each hole.

### **September 22, 2020 – CLOSING SHOTGUN SCRAMBLE AND AGM**

8:30 AM – Shotgun start, your starting hole will be indicated on the Draw.
