

## **Game of the Day Glossary for the 2019 Season**

### **General Reminders:**

Exchange scorecards at the first tee for Individual games, for Team games the four-some captain will keep score.

Always keep your own score for posting and check to make sure it matches the official scorecard at the end of the game. You must sign your scorecard to be eligible for prizes. Once you finish the round of golf, please deposit your signed scorecard in the wooden box on the table in the Ladies locker room.

All holes must be putted out, no conceded putts, unless it's allowable under the rules for the Game of the Day, i.e. 4-Ball Match play or the Eclectic Tournament. If you chose to 'pick up", you will not be eligible for the Game of the Day prizes.

Participation in the Toonie Pot is voluntary. If you choose to participate, please bring your toonie to the Pro Shop when you're checking in on Tuesday morning and sign-up.

### **Preseason: April 2, 2019 and April 9, 2019 – Regular Game of Golf**

For these two preseason games, we welcome returning members, and any prospective members, to come out for a round of golf. These will be regular games of golf, and the 4-somes will be made up randomly. Keep your own score, and if the course is in Active season, please post your scores. There will be one KP on #9 open to all participants.

### **April 16, 2019 – Opening Day Scramble and Lunch Meeting**

Please indicate your lunch choice on the sign-up sheet.

***PLEASE REMEMBER TO WEAR YOUR PINK GOLF SHIRT FOR CLUB COLOURS DAY.***

8:30AM – Shotgun start, your starting hole will be indicated on the Draw.

This is a team game: The four-woman scramble features teams of four players competing against one another. In this format, all team members hit from the tee box, the team then chooses the best of the four shots. All players – except the person whose ball is selected, hit the next shot from this mark. Play continues in this manner until at least one ball is on the green. Everyone takes one putt from the chosen location on the green. If the ball is not holed out, pick up the ball, and add one more stroke to the team score. (Count a maximum of 2 putts per hole.)  
Note: Use a minimum of 2 drives for each team member.

Prizes will be awarded to the team with the lowest gross score.

Additional prizes will be awarded for one KP on #9, one player who is Closest to the Line, and one Longest Drive. (Holes for Closest to the Line, and Longest Drive to be determined.)

### **April 23, 2019 – Fewest Putts**

This is an Individual game. Play a regular game and record the number of putts taken on the scorecard. (A putt is a shot taken once you're ON the green.) Winners will be members with the fewest putts in each flight.

Toonie Pot – KP on # 9 (flighted)

### **April 30, 2019 – Team Match Play**

Players will be divided into two teams, Team Wascana (Canadian 2018 LPGA event), and Team Priddis (Canadian 2016 LPGA event).

Each foursome will consist of two teams of two players competing directly against each other (four-ball match play). All four golfers play their own balls throughout the round; each hole is won by the team whose member has the lowest net score. If the hole is tied, each team gets half a point. Each player will play to the lowest handicap in the group, and will get strokes on holes based on this handicap differential. Keep track of how many points are won by each pairing as these scores will be used to determine the overall team score. (Keep your own score for posting purposes.)

Toonie Pot – Closest to the Line (flighted)

### **May 7, 2019 – Low Gross Flighted – Pin/Putts #1**

This is an Individual game. Winners will be determined by the lowest gross scores in 3 flights.

If you are participating in the Ladies Club Putts competition this year, please record your putts on the scorecard in the appropriate place. (A putt is a shot taken once you're ON the green.) If you are participating in the Pin Round competition your net score will be used for the year end results

Toonie Pot – KP #9 & KP #17 (flighted)

### **May 14, 2019 – Four Ball, Two Best Net**

This is a team game. Each player plays her own ball. On each hole, the two best net scores will be used for the score for that hole. Winners will be the teams with the lowest net scores. (Keep your own score for posting purposes.)

Toonie Pot – Longest Drive (flighted), KP #9 (one for all flights)

### **May 21, 2019 – Eclectic Tournament Day 1**

A two-day tournament playing for the Crystal Bowl Trophy. The final score is calculated by using your best gross score for each hole over the two days, minus your handicap. A luncheon and awards will follow the second round of golf.

### **May 28, 2019 – Eclectic Tournament Day 2**

### **June 4, 2019 - Individual Low Net – Beat the Champ/Beat the & Pro & Pin/Putts #2**

This is a regular game of golf. Winners in each flight will be determined by their net scores.

Beat the Champ - If you have paid the \$1 to participate in Beat the Champ your net score will be used for the competition. If your net score is better than the 2018 Provincial Amateur Champion's net score, you will have beaten the Champ.

Beat the Pro – If you are entered in Beat the Champ, you are automatically entered in the Beat the Pro competition. Prizes will be awarded to participants whose net score beats our Pro.

If you are participating in the Ladies Club Putts competition this year, please record your putts on the scorecard in the appropriate place. (A putt is a shot taken once you're ON the green.) If you are participating in the Pin Round competition your net score will be used for the year end results.

Toonie Pot – KP #9 & KP #17 (flighted)

***Beat the Champ description*** - is a round of golf played during the month of June (usually in the first week). Junior Golf Week was originally designed by the BC Ladies' Golf Association and is an important source of funds for junior development. All funds collected go directly to our Zone. The round is played against (in this year's case) the 2018 BC Women's Amateur Champion and decided by the player's net differential in relation to the Champion's lowest gross differential. Complicated? Yes! That is why most of us just consider this to be donation to a worthy cause. To add a fun dimension to the Beat the Champ round this year, we will also be playing Beat the Pro concurrently. Andy Hajer will join us on the course and is prepared to be throttled by our talented membership!!

### **June 11, 2019 – Team Stableford**

This is a team game. The team captain will keep the team's scores.  
(Please keep track of your own scores for posting.)

Stableford Scoring:

- 1 point for NET bogey
- 2 points for NET par
- 3 points for NET birdie
- 4 points for NET eagle
- 5 points for NET double eagle

The best 2 Stableford scores will be used on each hole.

Toonie Pot – KP #9 (flighted)

### **June 18, 2019 – Fewest Putts – Dorothy Olive Franklin & Pin/Putts 3**

This is an Individual game. Please play a regular game and record the number of putts taken on the scorecard. (A putt is a shot taken once you're ON the green.) Winners will be members with the fewest putts in each flight.

Dorothy Olive Franklin – If you have signed up for this competition, your net score will be used to determine which ARLGC member has the lowest net score for the day. The lowest net score will be submitted to Zone 5 for contention for the Zone's DOF award.

If you are participating in the Ladies Club Putts competition this year, your recorded putts will be used for this competition. If you are participating in the Pin Round competition your net score will be used for the year end results.

Toonie Pot – Closest to the Line

***Dorothy Olive Franklin Memorial Tournament*** - this is an annual provincial tournament to commemorate Dorothy's contribution to golf at the Club, Provincial and National levels. Proceeds are used to send promising junior golfers to out-of-province and international competitions. This tournament is also played during the month of June. One prize will be awarded to each Zone low net differential winner. Each Zone will then forward their winner's score card to the BC Office to determine the overall Provincial winner. Much like Beat the Champ, this is a chance to compete with fellow golfers in the Zone and in this case, also provincially. Again, most of us really just consider this a donation to a worthy cause. If you would like to play in the Dorothy Olive Franklin Memorial Tournament, please indicate this on your registration form.

### **June 25, 2019 – Diamond Stableford Tournament (Day 1)**

A two-day tournament playing for the Thunderbird Trophy. Teams of 4 players, using the Stableford scoring system record the two best scores on each hole. The Team with the highest two-day total will be the winner. A luncheon and awards will follow the second round of golf

### **June 27, 2019 – Diamond Stableford Tournament (Day 2)**

### **July 2, 2019 – Individual Low Net – Pin/Putts #4**

This is a regular game of golf. Winners in each flight will be determined by their net scores.

If you are participating in the Ladies Club Putts competition this year, please record your putts on the scorecard in the appropriate place. (A putt is a shot taken once you're ON the green.) If you are participating in the Pin Round competition your net score will be used for the year end results

Toonie Pot – Longest Drive (flighted), KP #9 (one for all flights)

### **July 9, 2019 – Team Match Play**

Players will be divided into two teams, Team Magna (Canadian 2019 LPGA event), and Team Hunt & Golf (Canadian 2017 LPGA event).

Each foursome will consist of two teams of two players competing directly against each other (four-ball match play). All four golfers play their own balls throughout the round; each hole is won by the team whose member has the lowest net score. If the hole is tied, each team gets half a point. Each player will play to the lowest handicap in the group, and will get strokes on holes based on this handicap differential. Keep track of how many points are won by each pairing as these scores will be used to determine the overall team score. (Keep your own score for posting purposes.)

Toonie Pot – KP #9 (flighted)

### **July 16, 2019 – Three Blind Mice**

This is an Individual game. In Three Blind Mice, three holes are selected randomly by the Pro Shop and nobody knows which have been selected. At the end of the round, the scores on those holes are thrown out. The 15 holes that remain are added up to create the Three Blind Mice score. The lowest net scores in each flight will win.

Toonie Pot – KP #9 & KP #17 (flighted)

### **July 23, 2019 – Senior/Super Senior Tournament – Day 1**

A 36-hole Stroke Play Tournament for the Dogwood Cup (Net) & the Whale Trophy (Gross). The Golden Girl Trophy for members 70 yrs.+ is awarded to the low net in this age group.

### **July 30, 2019 – Senior/Super Senior Tournament – Day 2**

### **August 6, 2019 – Fewest Putts – Pin/Putts #5**

This is an Individual game. Please play a regular game and record the number of putts taken on the scorecard. (A putt is a shot taken once you're ON the green.) Winners will be members with the fewest putts in each flight.

If you are participating in the Ladies Club Putts competition this year, your recorded putts will be used for this competition. If you are participating in the Pin Round competition your net score will be used for the year end results.

Toonie Pot – Closest to the Line (flighted)

### **August 13, 2019 – Team Match Play**

Players will be divided into two teams, Team Vancouver GC (Canadian 2015 LPGA event), and Team London Hunt & CC (Canadian 2014 LPGA event).

Each foursome will consist of two teams of two players competing directly against each other (four-ball match play). All four golfers play their own balls throughout the round; each hole is won by the team whose member has the lowest net score. If the hole is tied, each team gets half a point. Each player will play to the lowest handicap in the group, and will get strokes on holes based on this handicap differential. Keep track of how many points are won by each pairing as these scores will be used to determine the overall team score. (Keep your own score for posting purposes.)

Toonie Pot – Longest Drive (flighted), KP #9 (one for all flights)

### **August 20, 2019 – Blind Foursomes**

Foursomes are drawn anonymously at the completion of play. The foursome with the lowest combined net score is the winner.

Toonie Pot – KP #9 & KP #17 (flighted)

### **August 27, 2019 – Course closed for Aeration**

### **September 3, 2019 – Team Stableford**

This is a team game. The team captain will keep the team's scores.  
. (Keep your own score for posting purposes.)

Stableford Scoring:

- 1 point for NET bogey
- 2 points for NET par
- 3 points for NET birdie
- 4 points for NET eagle
- 5 points for NET double eagle

The best 2 Stableford scores will be used on each hole.

Toonie Pot – Closest to the Line (flighted)

### **September 10, 2019 – Low Gross Flighted - Pin #6**

This is an Individual game. Winners will be determined by the lowest gross scores in 3 flights.

If you are participating in the Pin Round competition your net score will be used for the year end results.

Toonie Pot – KP #9 & KP #17 (flighted)

### **September 17, 2019 – 4 Ball 2 Best Net**

This is a team game. Each player plays her own ball. On each hole, the two best net scores will be used for the score for that hole. Winners will be the teams with the lowest net scores. . (Keep your own score for posting purposes.)

Toonie Pot – KP #9 (flighted)

### **September 24, 2019 – Nickel Skins**

For this game, each player must bring 18 nickels to play. At the start of each hole, each player gives a nickel to the foursome captain. (The captain of each team should bring a "baggie" for the nickels). This is a four player match, played off the lowest handicap in the group. (See explanation under 4 Ball Match Play.) The NET winner of each hole wins the skin and the four nickels. If there is a tie the "pot" is carried forward to the next hole. If tied after 18, split the pot.

Toonie Pot – KP #9
